## Personal and Family Finance

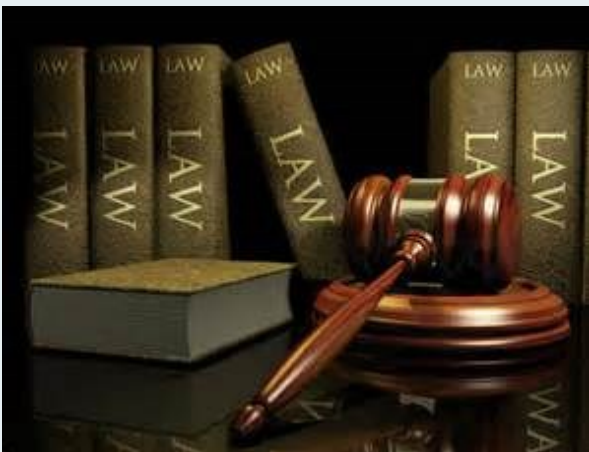

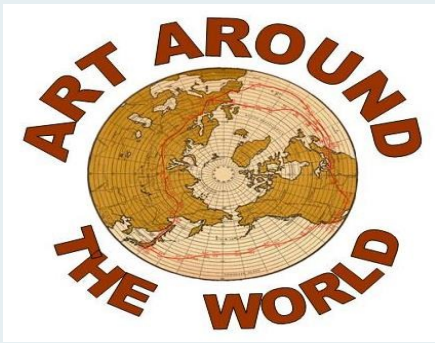

## Law Studies

### Art in World Cultures

## Driver's Education



Develop safe driving skills by studying the Highway Transportation System, road signs, rules of the road, and how to make good choices behind the wheel. This course covers the Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles required completion of the Traffic Law & Substance Abuse Education (TLSAE). Upon completion, receive a TLSAE certificate, a necessary step toward getting your learner's permit. This course is ideal for anyone interested in getting their learner's permit.

## Outdoor Education



Outdoor Education offers two unique opportunities. Students successfully completing the boating course work will earn a Florida Boating Safety Education ID Card. Upon successfully completing the hunting course work, students will earn the right to enter a Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission Field Day, leading to a Florida Hunter Education Certification. Course highlights include land and water activities, state-approved boater safety lessons; state-approved introduction to hunting lessons, guidelines and techniques stressing rules, regulations and ethical behavior and the emphasis on the practice of safety for a variety of outdoor and indoor sports.

## Peer Counseling



Gain the skills to help you succeed in all areas of your life. You will learn how to take action, set goals, manage your time and help your peers.

In this writing intensive course, students will explore parenting roles and responsibilities, nurturing and protective environments for children, positive strategies, self-esteem, brain development, and effective communication in parent-child relationships.

This course is for more mature students and is ideal for future parents, early childhood educators, or anyone interested in working with young children.
