11		Take the Accelerated High School Registration Approval Form to FSW Registrar's Office and register for classes.
12		Print your Student Detail Schedule and turn it in to your counselor (sample on page 8). Your textbooks will NOT be ordered until this step is complete.
13		Check out your textbooks from FMHS Media Center.
14		Check your FSW Portal to be sure you are registered for the classes you think you are registered for.
15		Attend all classes, monitor your grades frequently, contact your professor for extra help if necessary, and check your FSW e-mail regularly for important messages from the college.
16		Check the FMHS website, Twitter page, and FMHS student e-mail for upcoming events on the FMHS campus.
